We all care about our lake. Most of us just don't have extra time or we really don't think we have the expertise to be effective.

No expertise needed!

We have a handful of experts on our lake who are willing to take the responsibility for identifying plants that should be forwarded to the DNR. You do **not** have to identify EWM (Eurasian Watermilfoil).

What is expected of volunteers?

Your main responsibility is to greet the boaters entering our lake and check and remove any vegetation on their boat or trailer. Our goal is boater education about keeping milfoil out of our lake.

It's simple and easy and friendly. Most boaters already understand the importance of what you are doing because they have

seen what EWM has done to other lakes. A large banner that says "Welcome – AIS Boat Inspections" shows anyone entering the boat landing that we are there.

We'll train you – all supplies are provided. Everything you need is already at the boat landing. And you get a FREE Clean Boats Clean Water t-shirt that identifies you as a volunteer.

Simply by being there, we send a message that our lake is important to us. Please reply that you will help.
